\$1 BILLION **SAFE & SECURE WATER PROGRAM**

In June the NSW Government announced \$1 billion to fund local water infrastructure through the Safe and Secure Water Program. This new investment program, developed by DPI Water, is aimed at water and sewerage projects in regional NSW to ensure infrastructure meets contemporary standards for water security, public health and environmental and safety outcomes into the future.


The program underpins the future sustainability of NSW regional economies and supports the 1.9 million people that live in more than 500 regional NSW communities. The program will provide co-funding to successful applicants such as local councils, water utilities, water corporations and prescribed dam owners for detailed planning and construction activities to install, augment or decommission water and sewerage infrastructure.

Focus areas will be initially identified using an innovative new catchment-wide framework, based on security of supply, health and infrastructure risks and emerging issues that can impact on supply and demand. This framework allows for a strategic and long-term approach and ensures the funding is targeted towards critical projects. The \$1 billion fund

includes an already announced \$500 million to construct a flagship Murray River to Broken Hill pipeline. For more information go to this website.

LATEST PUBLICATION: **OPERATIONS AND** MAINTENANCE MANUAL FOR PRESSURE SEWERAGE **SYSTEMS**

A new standalone publication arising from the update of our Operations and Maintenance Manual for Sewer Reticulation 2003. undertaken by Mike Brearley and Associates was distributed to member Councils at the end of June.

DR PAUL BYLEVELD RECOGNISED FOR CONTRIBUTIONS TO PUBLIC HEALTH

Congratulations to Paul Byleveld on being named in the Queen's Birthday 2017 Honours List as a recipient of the Public Service Medal (PSM). Paul is well known and respected in the NSW local government water industry and was honoured for outstanding public service to the development of improved water quality and public health in NSW. It is very fitting that Paul's role particularly in establishing the Aboriginal Communities Water and Sewerage Program be acknowledged and he is also well known for his overseas humanitarian work.

The Aboriginal Communities Water and Sewerage Program is a very successful program that has been running for almost a decade and has been improving water supply and sewerage services in eligible Aboriginal communities in NSW. This program, which began in July 2008, is a joint initiative of the NSW Government and the NSW Aboriginal Land Council and is managed by the NSW Office of Water.

Together, the NSW Government and the Land Council are investing more than \$200 million over a 25 year period to provide funding for the maintenance, operation and repair of water supply and sewerage systems in 61 eligible Aboriginal



communities. The program aims to raise the standard of service by engaging local water utilities with expertise and experience in the management of water supply and sewerage systems to take responsibility for the day-today operation and maintenance activities. Consultation is arranged between the local Aboriginal community, the local water utility, DPI Water and other interested stakeholders to examine the existing infrastructure and services and discuss what actions need to be taken to improve the service levels to the standard expected in the wider community.

Paul is Manager Water Unit, Environmental Health Branch in NSW Health and he has also participated in many international efforts to restore safe water supplies in humanitarian crises and natural disaster zones. Paul's PSM is well deserved.

MIDCOAST WATER TO INTEGRATE INTO MIDCOAST COUNCIL

On 28 June NSW Minister for Environment, Local Government and Heritage, the Hon. Gabrielle Upton MP, approved the proposal to dissolve MidCoast Water and move its functions into MidCoast Council. His Excellency General the Hon. David Hurley AC DSC (Ret'd) Governor of NSW has issued a proclamation that the proposal be implemented from 1 July.
