What project is needed to help members deal with this? Jen James, Service Development Consultant, LGNSW Proposal for online survey of gaps in training and skills	<ul> <li>Research on workforce last done 3 years ago. Systematic data collection processes needed, to monitor training issues, course delivery. All councils need to do forward workforce planning.</li> <li>2014/15 Occupational Profiling of Water Industry done by Jen. Need to revisit to identify skills shortages and gaps, future profile of the workforce.</li> <li>Are you able to access training, and what is your expenditure on learning and development?</li> <li>Jen suggests a WD funded survey to look at gaps, to be filled in by every water manager – need 60% response in order to be useful.</li> <li>JI is on the IRC, Gary on the ITAB, this information will be useful to feed into these mechanisms.</li> <li>Survey can be replicated every 3 years to pick up trends</li> </ul>	Consider a second skills shortage survey every 5 years, ie in 2 years' time.

	Carl Radford, WSAA LWU versions of WSAA's Water Supply and Sewerage Codes	<ul> <li>Codes provide technical documentation for planners, designers and constructors serving land development industry or undertaking contract work on behalf of water engineers.</li> <li>These are voluntary codes, there are some barriers that prevent national standardisation</li> <li>Codes are moving to HTML format (Adobe FrameMaker) so can be updated continuously and based on common core with State changes</li> <li>Scalable vector graphics so you can view on any platform including phones</li> <li>Project funded by WSAA with input from members and interested parties. Members access codes for free, others 50% off (details available from Carl) Intention is to make this affordable, less than \$200.</li> <li>Fit for purpose codes that can be used by LWUs, including standard drawings. Hope to produce a generic code that can be used by NSW and QLD</li> </ul>
