







CHAIR'S REPORT

I know I speak for all the Executive Committee in warmly thanking retiring Chair Jeff Sharp who stepped down at our November 2017 AGM, after he was promoted from Director Infrastructure and Asset Management at Port Macquarie-Hastings Council to a new role there as Strategy and Growth Director. Previously in March 2017 Jeff received a 15 year medallion and was only the fifth Executive Committee member to achieve this great milestone. When Jeff stood down from the Executive Committee he had represented the Mid North Coast Group of Councils for almost 16 years including the last 4 years as Chair of the Water Directorate. I wish him success in his new position.

Since being elected Chair, my main goal has been to review and update the Water Directorate's Strategic Business Plan. A tender process resulted in the Executive Committee appointing Professor Roberta Ryan, Director of the Centre for Local Government, University of Technology, to undertake the task.

Professor Ryan undertook a thorough process of researching the regional and rural water industry, surveying Water Directorate member councils and interviewing key stakeholders about the role and performance of the Water Directorate. She looked for gaps, areas of duplication and opportunities for partnerships. She talked to government and industry experts to obtain a wide view of the key issues facing local water utilities water now and in future.

It was heartening that 116 Water Directorate members responded to Professor Ryan's survey, a 65% response rate, which is remarkably high for online surveys. It is also pleasing to note that just under 70% of respondents are either very or somewhat satisfied with the Water Directorate.

The top issues members identified in the survey were shortage of skilled technical staff, ageing infrastructure/ cost of maintenance and cost of compliance with new proposed health-based targets.

Members said they want the Water Directorate to support LGNSW to advocate for the regional water sector and focus on capacity-building for all LWUs, with a focus on smaller councils. One exciting option for the future is for the Water Directorate to form partnerships with one or more water or infrastructure organisations, whose objectives and activities align with ours, in order to better meet the needs of members by improving economies of scope and scale.

The final stage of the project is for Professor Ryan to prepare a plan that positions the Water Directorate to be relevant and useful to the rural and regional water sector going forward, and to make sure resources are being allocated to meeting the priorities of our members.

As the Water Directorate approaches its 20th anniversary, I would like to honour the many people who have volunteered their time as members of the Executive Committee over the years. We have built the organisation to be a highly respected expert body that is unique in providing technical resources to - and advocating on behalf of - the water and sewer industry in rural and regional New South Wales.

There were some changes to the Executive Committee during the year. We welcomed David Kirby from Brewarrina Shire Council, Phil Hood from Upper Hunter Shire Council and Terence Seymour from Uralla Shire Council as new members. Brendan Guiney, MidCoast Council, returned following a brief hiatus and Mark Hely replaced outgoing LGNSW representative Sascha Moege who stepped down after ten years with the Executive Committee. Many thanks to Sascha and to departing members Alan Fletcher from Upper Hunter Shire Council, David Wolfenden from Moree Plains Shire Council and Phil Redan from Muswellbrook Shire Council who also resigned during the year.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REVIEW

Within a few months of publishing this Annual Review, we will be celebrating proudly the 20 year anniversary of the Water Directorate's official commencement in December 1998.

Our core business has always been to provide technical advice in the form of manuals and guidelines and in 17/18 we produced and distributed a further 5 publications to our 86 member Councils. A secondary function of the Water Directorate has been to promote, encourage and reward excellent work done in NSW by LWUs and in doing so we presented a further 6 sponsored awards.

Over 20 years the total number of publications distributed to member Councils including 7 WIOA Guidelines is 85 and the total number of sponsored awards presented is 61. I draw your attention to the timeline on pages 6 and 7 showing a comprehensive record of the Water Directorate's publications and awards as well as some significant events. It shows that 41 publications were produced in the first decade and 44 in the second decade. After 20 years the publication production rate is consistently over 4 publications per year. The timeline shows the production of publications decreased in the 'middle third' ie 2005 to 2013 however this is explained by the development of and involvement in the Water Loss Management Program which ran from 2006 to 2011 which was undertaken in partnership with LGNSW and with funding from the Federal Government. The timeline history also shows the 5 Water Directorate Chairs and staff to date.

The 17/18 publications are:

- Third Party Infrastructure on Water Supply Reservoirs Guidelines Part 1, Engineering Aspects NEW - Joint publication with Queensland Water Directorate
- Third Party Infrastructure on Water Supply Reservoirs Guidelines Part 2, Legal Aspects NEW
- Report on Smart Metering Technology NEW
- Operations and Maintenance Manual for Water Pumping Stations UPDATE
- Cutting, Handling and Disposal of Asbestos Cement Pipes Guidelines UPDATE

Currently the subject of the first two companion guidelines above is an area of great concern for NSW LWUs. The issue of third party infrastructure on water supply reservoirs is also commonly known as telcos on tanks. The first publication of the pair above is a joint publication with and managed by the Queensland Water Directorate. Boil water alerts appear to have been caused by contamination from birds roosting or nesting in reservoirs via damaged roofing caused by third party infrastructure on water supply reservoirs and thus requiring the necessity for careful internal/external inspections of reservoirs. The 17/18 awards are:

- Sam Samra Joint Award went to Gunnedah Shire Council in September 2017 NEW – this is the 1st year of presenting this award
- International WaterCentre Water Leader Scholarship went to Laljibhai Rathod from Kempsey Shire Council NEW in October 2017 - this is the **1st year** of presenting this award
- LGNSW Excellence in the Environment Award Water Conservation Award went to Parkes Shire Council for their Integrated Water Infrastructure Renewal Project - this is the **4th year** of presenting this award after a previous 3 year involvement.
- WIOA Operator of the Year Award went to Dave Cashen from Bathurst Regional Council in April 2018 – this is the **12th year** of presenting this award since it was established by WIOA at the first NSW conference at Dubbo in 2007.
- Ozwater'18 Conference Attendance Award went to Tamarin Taylor from Riverina Water County Council in May 2018 – this is the **15th year** of presenting this award since the initiative was established by the Water Directorate in 2004.
- IPWEA NSW Conference Excellence Award Innovation in Water Supply and Wastewater Award went to Eurobodalla Shire Council for their Rosedale & Guerrilla Bay Pressure Sewerage Scheme Project; and the Highly Commended Award went to both Narrabri Shire Council, and to Shoalhaven City Council at Hunter Valley in November 2017. This is the **18th year** of presenting this award since initiating it in 1999 and commencing in 2000 at Penrith Panthers.

The Water Directorate Forum was facilitated at the LGNSW Water Management Conference at Dubbo in September 2017 by me with assistance from Forum panellists Graham Kennett, Jason Ip, David Oxenham and Robert Siebert – this is the **15th year** of facilitating this Forum commencing in 2003 at Taree.

The Water Directorate Stream at IPWEA NSW Div Conference at the Hunter Valley in November 2017 was facilitated by me for approximately the **18th year** over a 19 year period commencing in 1999 at Penrith Panthers.

In October 2017 the Water Directorate made a submission to the IPART's Review of the Local Government Rating System collating comments from member Councils.





As per past practice, membership fees rise each year by CPI. Income increased slightly in 2017/18 by 1.5% as a result of increases in four components of income. The only component of income that decreased was investment income which decreased by 52.4%. The 17.5% increase in sales of publications was against the trend.

Expenditure in 2017/18 was intentionally reduced by 16.5% to accord with the May 2017

Executive Committee resolution that Funds Held/ Balance end of year should be 2 to 3 months of expenditure instead of the long standing general agreement that Funds Held/Balance end of year should be 10% of Total Income. The target Funds Held/Balance end of year was 2 months of the previously recorded maximum expenditure, ie \$120,000 and the actual Funds Held/Balance end of year came in at approximately \$110,000.
